3. Hazards identification

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4. First-aid measures

Skin exposure : Remove contaminated clothes. Wash thoroughly with soap and water. Contact physician if irritation persists.
Ingestion : Rinse mouth with water and obtain medical attention.

5. Fire-fighting measures

Extinguishing media : Carbon dioxide, dry chemical, foam.
Do not use a direct water-jet on burning material.

6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions : Avoid inhalation and contact with skin and eyes. A self-contained breathing apparatus is recommended in case of a major spill.
Spillage : Remove ignition sources. Provide adequate ventilation. Avoid excessive inhalation of vapours. Gross spillage should be contained immediately by use of sand or inert powder and disposed of according to local regulations.

7. Handling and storage

Storage : Store in a cool, dry and ventilated area away from heat sources and protected from light in tightly closed original containers. Avoid plastic and uncoated metal containers. Keep air contact to a minimum.
